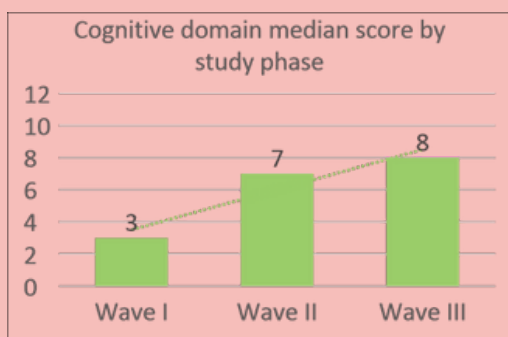




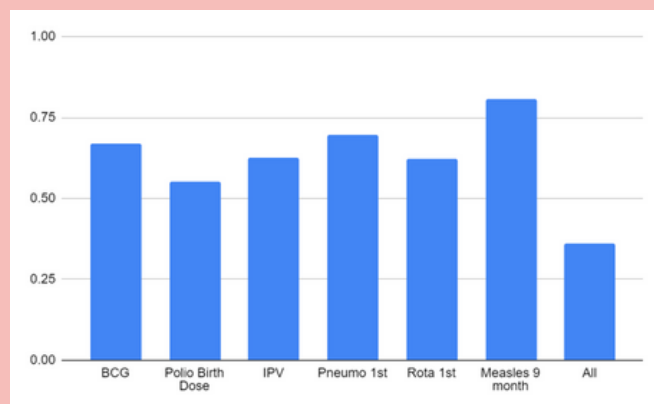
JAMAA NA AFYA YA MTOTO

The JAMO project studies the extent to which kinship support and marriage benefit mothers and children in low income, urban African settings. The study consists of six waves of surveys and three rounds of qualitative data collection in two low-income communities in Nairobi, Kenya. The starting sample includes 1,203 mothers aged 18–29 with a child aged 0–24 months.

HOW DOES MATERNAL EDUCATION AFFECT CHILDREN'S DEVELOPMENT?



COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT IS PROGRESSING WITH AGE, AS EXPECTED.



PROPORTION OF CHILDREN RECEIVING ALL VACCINATION TYPES IS LOW.

COMMUNICATION DEVELOPMENT BY MOTHER'S EDUCATION

CHILDREN OF MOTHERS WITH SECONDARY EDUCATION GAIN COMMUNICATION SKILLS MORE RAPIDLY DURING THEIR FIRST TWO YEARS OF LIFE. HOWEVER, CHILDREN OF MOTHERS WITHOUT SECONDARY EDUCATION CLOSE THE GAP AT AROUND 25 MONTHS.
