

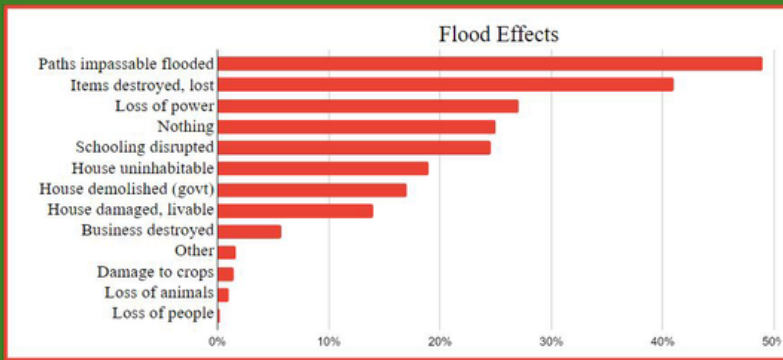


# JAMAA NA AFYA YA MTOTO

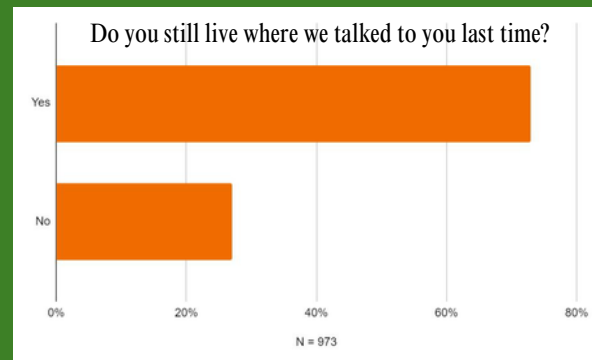
The JAMO project studies the extent to which kinship support and marriage benefit mothers and children in low income, urban African settings. The study consists of six waves of surveys and three rounds of qualitative data collection in two low-income communities in Nairobi, Kenya. The starting sample includes 1,203 mothers aged 18–29 with a child aged 0–24 months.

## COPING WITH FLOODING

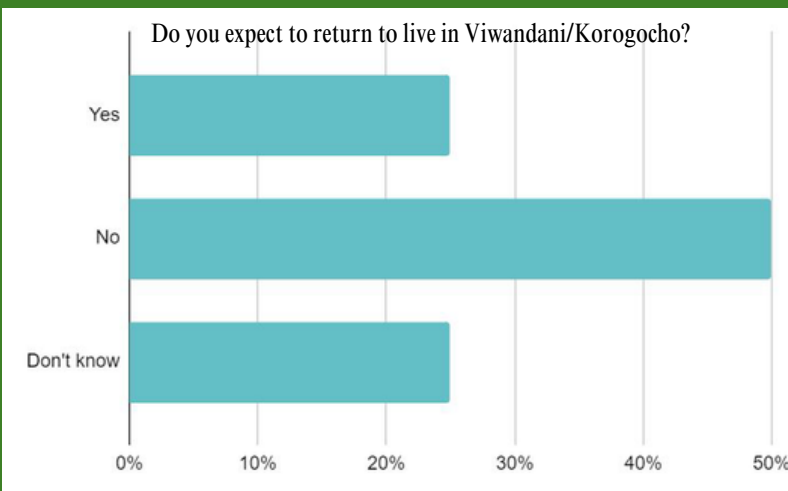
In April of 2024, Kenya experienced a severe flooding event that caused significant damage in the two communities. In response, a telephone survey was administered to track the JAMO respondents and understand how they were affected



Nearly 50% of respondents experienced impassable paths.



About 25% of respondents are not living where they were at the last wave.



50% of respondents not living in Viwandani/Korogocho said they do not expect to return.
